DISCUSSION

Additional isolated showers and thunderstorms may develop late this afternoon through the evening. A few thunderstorms may pose the risk for hail to the size of quarters, damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph, and an isolated tornado or landspout. There is the potential for additional rainfall amounts of 1-2" that may support localized flooding. Meanwhile, strong southerly wind gusts of up to 35 mph become northwesterly behind the frontal passage this evening. Wind gusts increase to 45-55 mph overnight. Rain transitions to snow late tonight into early Wednesday morning. Light accumulations may result in a few slick spots, especially on elevated roadways. The combination of gusty winds and snow will result in reduced visibilities to a half mile or less at times.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
