### **DISCUSSION**

Slight Risk for strong to severe thunderstorms late Monday night through Tuesday. Primary hazards are damaging wind gusts and large hail. Concern is increasing about flooding from heavy rainfall on Tuesday and Wednesday, with a widespread Slight Excessive Rainfall Risk. Shower and thunderstorm chances continue on Wednesday and Thursday. The potential for heavy rainfall and flooding increase with repeated rounds.

Additional strong to severe thunderstorm chances linger through Tuesday, with damaging winds as the primary concern. Showers and storms will continue through the week, with repeated heavy rainfall over the same areas increasing risk of river and flash flooding on Tuesday and Wednesday.

#### **CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- · Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
