DISCUSSION

Strong to severe thunderstorms are expected to move into the area this morning, with severe thunderstorm hazards primarily being hail up quarters and damaging wind gusts up to 60 to 70 mph. There is a low potential for additional thunderstorm development behind the cold front this afternoon, and if afternoon thunderstorms are able to form, supercells with all hazards (primarily large hail) could be expected. Heavy rainfall with the day's thunderstorms will elevate river and flash flood risks in southwest Missouri. Several rounds of showers and thunderstorms will bring additional rainfall to the region through Thursday. Breaks between rounds will be short, which will limit recovery and sustain concerns for river and flash flooding.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
 "Turn around . . . don't drown!"
