DISCUSSION

Another round of showers and thunderstorms are expected to move through the area tonight, bringing mainly a lightning risk. However, there is a conditional risk for strong to severe thunderstorms with damaging wind gusts up to 70 mph and a brief tornado or two being the main hazards, though hail up to quarters are also possible. Heavy rainfall with the thunderstorms will elevate river and flash flood risks in southwest Missouri. Another round of showers and thunderstorms is forecast to move through Wednesday afternoon and evening with damaging winds being the main hazard. Hail up to quarters and a brief tornado or two cannot be ruled out. Additional Scattered showers and thunderstorms will bring additional rainfall and lightning risk to the region through Thursday.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
