### DISCUSSION

Flood Watch continues through 7 AM Thursday with a Slight Risk for excessive rainfall. Continuing rounds of showers and thunderstorms will result in additional amounts of 1 to 3 inches, with localized higher amounts up to 5 inches, especially along the southern Missouri border. Shower and thunderstorm chances continue during the day Thursday. Therefore, any lingering flood impacts may continue for areas receiving more heavy rainfall. Warming trend and relatively drier weather are expected this weekend into early next week.

### CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- “When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

**“Turn around . . . don’t drown!”**

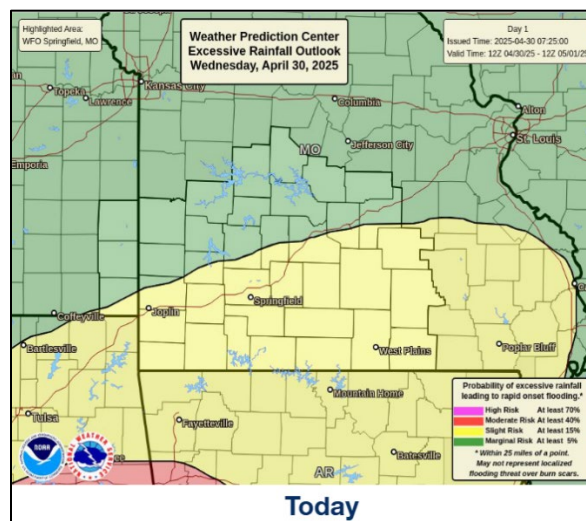
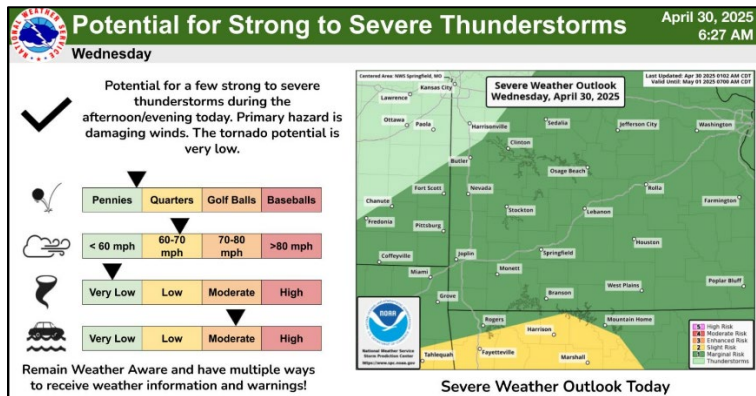
