Sales Tax Received in May 2025 (April 2025 processing)


County's General Sales Tax is <u>Up 1.26%</u> for this month compared to the same month in 2024 or <u>Up 19,252</u> in 1984 voter approved General Fund portion and <u>Down 0.06%</u> year-to-date compared to the same period in 2024 or <u>Down</u> **\$1,678** (March 2025 processing through February 2026 processing).

- Six of the top fifty remitters went unprocessed for an average total of \$42,528 and one of the previous five unprocessed did not have balances close to twice their average this month for an average total of \$18,145. The top fifty remitters represent 48.5% of tax receipts.
- Current activity suggests 1984 voter approved General Fund portion of Sales Tax for 2025 will end the year at 18,961,812 which is at 93.15% of budget or \$1,394,438 below 2025 general revenue Fund 101 budget of \$20,356,250 and \$128,889 below 2024 actual. However, this is just the two months of the year and they are historically months that are below average in receipts.

Trend Lines

The 3-Month trend line <u>decreased</u> 0.01% this month and the 12-Month trend line <u>increased</u> 0.48% decreasing the now positive gap from +2.00% to +1.51%. The trend lines continue to indicate an increasing growth in sales tax related spending; however, the 3-Month trend line has been moving sideways for the last few months instead of increasing the GAP between lines. This slow down in short-term retail spending coincides with a change in consumer confidence, the decrease of stability in the markets and increased inflation expectations.

Last month March was the only month below previous year. Now those positions have reversed. A strong second month of postings turned current March higher that previous, while smaller 3rd and 4th month posting for February and January depicts a slowing of retail spending in 2025. It appears a larger volume of retail sales were being reported/processed later than they are in 2025. This leads to an appearance of stronger volume in 2025, until now. Concerns over the economy may have had a negative affect on consumer retail spending. As prices rise on basic necessities, sales tax is expected to increase.
