DISCUSSION

Multiple rounds of thunderstorms are expected this afternoon into tonight, with a severe risk present with any storm that develops between 12 PM to 2 AM. All hazards will be possible, including hail up to the size of golf balls and damaging winds up to 60 to 70 mph, and tornadoes, some potentially strong. The last round of storms overnight could be a squall line capable of wind gusts up to 70 to 80 mph and spin-up tornadoes. Along with the severe risk, a localized flooding threat is present for any areas that see multiple heavy thunderstorms. Localized rainfall amounts up to 5 to 7 inches are possible. A Flood Watch is in effect from 1 PM today to 7 AM Tuesday to cover this threat.

Additional showers and thunderstorms are possible Tuesday (20-40% chance). Some storms may become strong to severe generally east of Highway 63 during the afternoon hours. Large hail up to golf balls and damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph, and a low chance for a tornado will be the main hazards.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
