DISCUSSION

There is a 30 to 50 percent chance of scattered showers and thunderstorms after 6 PM and before 5 AM tonight, generally along and south of Highways 60 and 160. A few isolated storms may become strong to severe with large hail up to the size of golf balls being the main hazard. Wind gusts up to 60 mph may also be possible.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
