DISCUSSION

Shower and thunderstorm chances (60 to 90%) return Tuesday through next weekend. Storms may be strong to severe Tuesday evening into Tuesday night. There is a marginal to slight risk for excessive rainfall and severe thunderstorms Tuesday evening into Wednesday morning, with the far northwest corner of Greene County under a marginal risk for tornadoes.

A Flood Watch has been issued for Tuesday evening into Wednesday morning, for areas mainly northwest of Interstate 44.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **"When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"

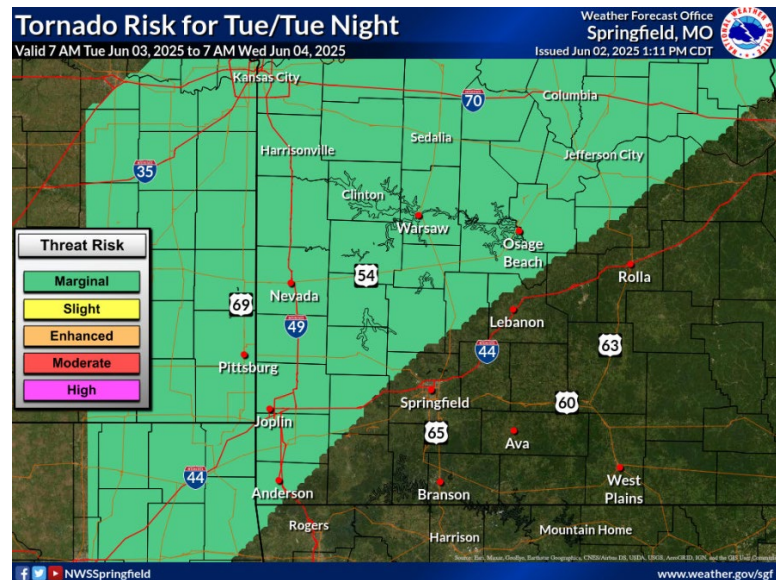
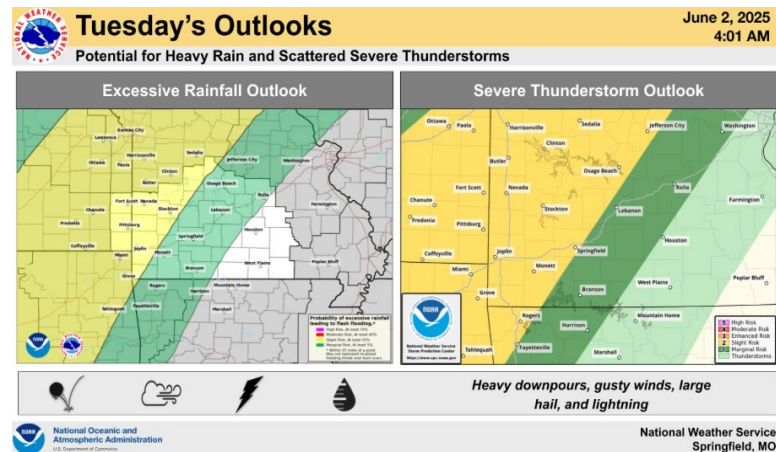
