DISCUSSION

Thunderstorms will develop over the area while additional storms move in from the west late this afternoon through the overnight hours. These storms will be capable of producing flooding, 70 mph wind gusts, hail to the size of half dollars, and brief, isolated tornadoes.

A Flood Watch has been issued for Tuesday evening into Wednesday morning, for areas mainly northwest of Interstate 44. Excessive runoff may result in flooding of rivers, creeks, streams, and other low-lying and flood-prone locations. Low-water crossings may be flooded. Training showers and thunderstorms are expected to result in widespread rainfall amounts of 1 to 3 inches with localized higher amounts up to 5 inches possible.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"

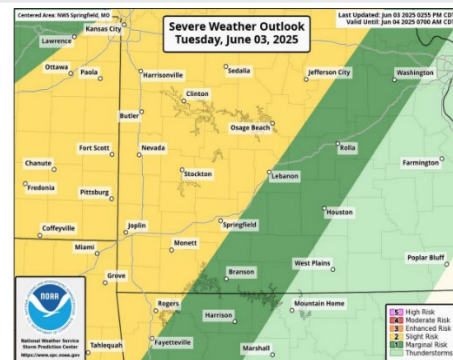

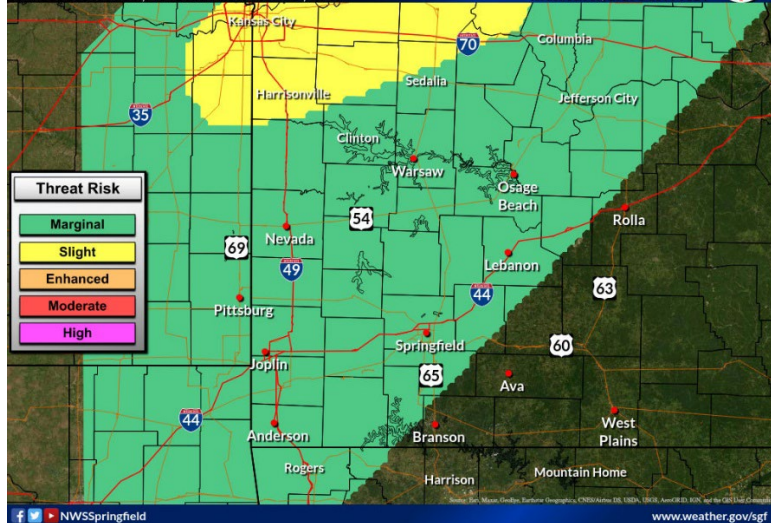

Tornado Risk for Tue/Tue Night

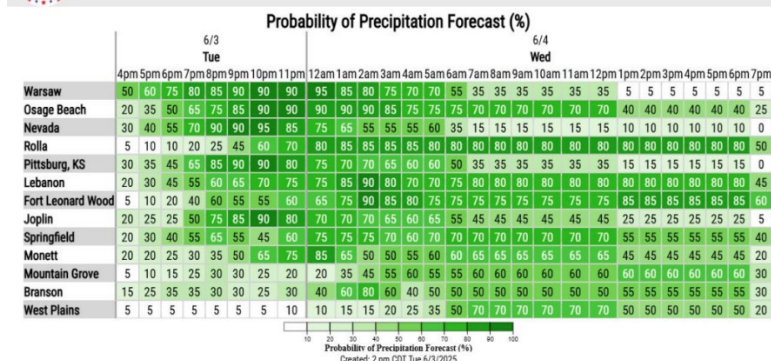
