DISCUSSION

Flood Watch in effect through this evening. Additional rainfall amounts from noon today to midnight tonight of 1 to 3 inches with the potential for localized amounts up to 5 inches. Highest amounts are expected along the I-44 corridor.

Marginal risk for severe thunderstorms this afternoon east of Highway 65. Damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph, dime sized hail, and frequent lightning are the main hazards.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"


