#### **DISCUSSION**

The first round of severe risk comes late Tuesday night into Wednesday morning, with an enhanced (level 3 of 5) Risk of severe weather in eastern Kansas and a Slight (level 2 of 5) Risk in western Missouri. Second round of severe risk Wednesday afternoon/evening, with a widespread Slight (level 2 of 5) risk across the Ozarks. The area of highest severe risk will hinge on how early and how far west storms develop on Wednesday afternoon. Localized flooding potential where heavy rainfall occurs. Heating up this weekend, with very muggy conditions causing apparent temperatures to approach Heat Advisory conditions.

### **CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
