#### DISCUSSION

The first round of severe risk comes this afternoon with an enhanced (level 3 of 5) risk of severe weather in eastern Kansas and part of western Missouri. Second round of severe risk Wednesday afternoon/evening, with a widespread Slight (level 2 of 5) risk across the Ozarks and Enhanced risk (level 3 of 5) over the eastern Ozarks. Localized flooding potential where heavy rainfall occurs. Heating up this weekend, with very muggy conditions causing apparent temperatures to approach Heat Advisory conditions.

#### CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

**"Turn around . . . don't drown!"**
