### DISCUSSION

The severe threat this afternoon and evening has been drastically reduced. Morning convection prevented storms from initiating off the cold front as it moved through the area throughout the day. The tail end of this front may initiate some isolated thunderstorms in the southern portions of our area (as can be seen in northeast Oklahoma and McDonald County at the moment), but the severe threat with these thunderstorms will be much more limited than previously thought. They will still be capable of being severe, but their isolated nature and lack of support will keep impacts limited. They would develop largely south of I-44. Some more sub-severe development is expected from the north overnight. Humid and very warm temperatures through the weekend into early next week.

### CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **"When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

**"Turn around . . . don't drown!"**
