#### **DISCUSSION**

Widespread rain and a few embedded thunderstorm chances ramp up this evening through Thursday as a band of rain and a few thunderstorms develop somewhere southwest of a Nevada-Springfield-Gainesville line. Lightning and localized flooding will be possible with any training thunderstorms.

We could see 2-4 inches of rain across the southwest corner of Missouri and southeast corner of Kansas. Potential localized amounts up to 5-7 inches may lead to isolated river and/or flash flooding.

Greatest coverage and heaviest rain expected 1AM through 12 PM Thursday.

## **CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT**

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
