### DISCUSSION

The atmosphere will be conducive for thunderstorms and potential severe weather Tuesday night. Two areas of thunderstorms look to occur with this system. Both areas will have a risk for damaging winds (60-70 mph), large hail (quarter to golf ball sized), and a tornado.

One area of storms looks to occur mainly north of Highway 54. The other area of storms looks to affect areas south of Interstate 44.

Most likely time storms will move into the northern circled area will be after 9pm. The areas south of I-44 may not see storms until 12am-3am Wednesday.

### CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
