DISCUSSION

There is high confidence in a line of strong to severe storms to develop along a cold front this evening into tonight. The primary risk is damaging straight line winds. A few brief tornadoes may occur. The greatest severe potential will be along and west of a Branson to Rolla line.

There is potential for localized heavy rainfall that may lead to some flash flooding. Widespread rainfall amounts of 0.5-1.0" with localized heavier amounts of 1-2".

Cooler temperatures will occur behind the front this weekend into early next week, as lows in the 30s are expected Sunday and Monday mornings.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **"When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
