DISCUSSION

there is a 30% chance for non-severe thunderstorms north of interstate 44 tonight. There is a marginal risk for severe thunderstorms on Friday, mainly along and south of a line from Fort Scott, KS to Marshfield, Mo to west plains. 1 inch hail and 60 mph winds the primary threats.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
