DISCUSSION

Showers and thunderstorms are developing and moving across the area this morning. How quickly this development ends and storms dissipate this morning will have implications on severe weather potential this afternoon/evening. The most severe potential outcome would involve large hail, damaging winds, and a few tornadoes.

Heavy rainfall could cause localized flooding. Damaging wind gusts of 35-40 mph will be possible outside of thunderstorms at times today/tonight as well.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

“Turn around . . . don’t drown!”
