DISCUSSION

A Flood Watch continues until 1PM Monday. There is a moderate excessive rainfall risk tonight into early Monday. Any severe storms can produce brief and/or weak tornados, hail to the size of quarters, and wind gusts up to 60 mph. A slight risk (2 of 4) for excessive rainfall Monday and a marginal risk of (1 of 5) of severe weather Monday night. Forecast widespread rainfall totals of 1 to 3 inches through Monday.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **“When thunder roars . . . go indoors!”**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.
