DISCUSSION

A Flood Watch continues until 7AM Tuesday. There is a slight (2 out of 4) excessive rainfall risk for flash flooding tonight into Tuesday morning as a complex of thunderstorms is expected to move through the area. This complex may result in additional flooding and severe thunderstorms. Primary risk is damaging wind gusts of 60 to 70 mph. There is remaining uncertainty on the evolution of the complex, including how long it remains strong to severe into the area Tuesday morning. Due to the difficult to predict nature of thunderstorms, the exact rainfall amount locations will likely be different than shown here. High/efficient rainfall rates can reach 1 to 3 inches per hour.

Additionally, a Heat Advisory is in effect Tuesday from 12pm until 7am Wednesday morning. Maximum afternoon heat index values around 100 to 105. Maximum afternoon Wet Bulb Globe Temperatures around 84 to 88.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **"When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

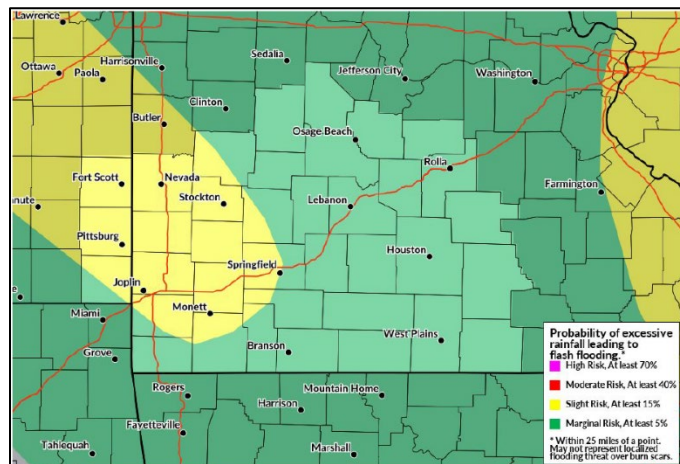

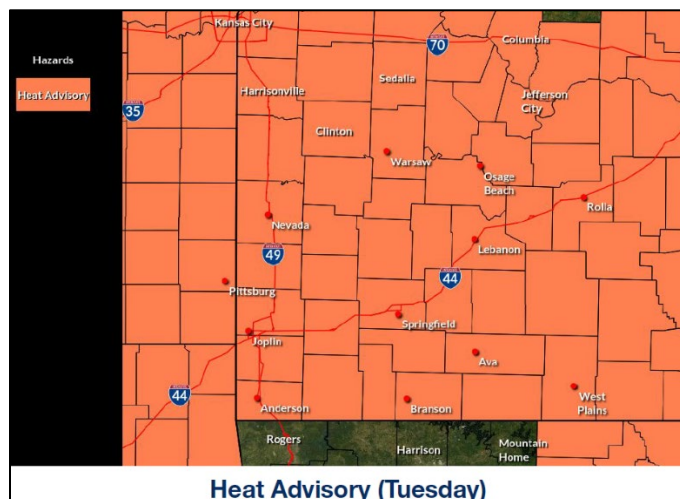
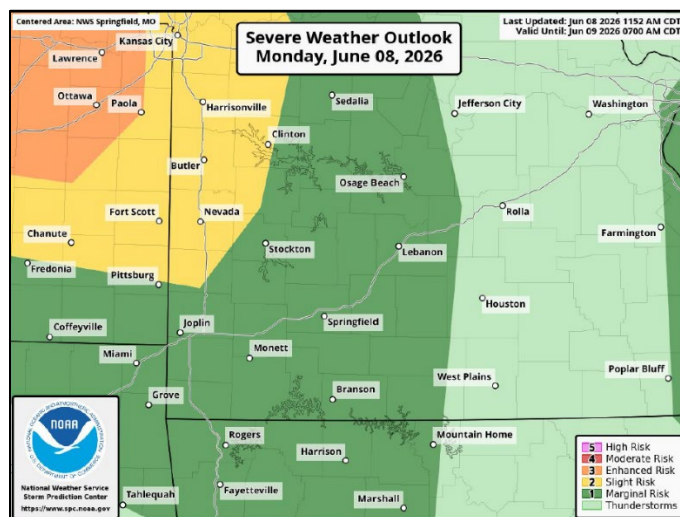
