DISCUSSION

Slight (2 of 5) risk for strong to severe thunderstorms this afternoon and evening.

3 pm - 5 pm: Discrete storms developing and becoming organized into multi-cell clusters. Hazards: Damaging wind gusts up to 70 mph. Large hail up to golf balls. A tornado or two.

5 pm - 7 pm: A line of thunderstorms continues to move southeast. Hazards: Damaging wind gusts up to 70 mph. Large hail up to quarters. A brief tornado.

7 pm - 11 pm: A line of thunderstorms continues southeast and begins to gradually decrease in intensity. Hazards: Damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph. Isolated hail up to quarters.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **"When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
