DISCUSSION

Marginal risk for severe thunderstorms late this evening and overnight. Elevated hail and isolated damaging winds will be the primary severe risk. A Flood Watch has been issued for portions of the Ozarks from 1 AM tonight through 7 PM Sunday morning. Slight (2 out of 5) to Enhanced (3 out of 5) risk for severe thunderstorms Saturday evening and night. Damaging winds will be the primary severe risk, with hail and brief tornadoes as secondary hazards. Moderate risk (4 out of 5) for Excessive Rainfall early Saturday into Sunday.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- "When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
