DISCUSSION

Slight (2 of 5) to Enhanced (3 of 5) Severe Risk for severe thunderstorms late this afternoon into tonight with all hazards possible. Primary hazards are hail up to baseball size, 70-80 mph winds, and a few tornadoes. The greatest severe risk is across central MO. Localized heavy rainfall may support localized flash flooding this evening and tonight. Marginal (1 of 5) Severe Risk for severe thunderstorms on Thursday into early Thursday night, mainly along and south of I-44. Large hail to the size of golf balls, damaging winds up to 60 mph, and flash flooding are possible.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **"When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
