DISCUSSION

Potential for two rounds of showers and thunderstorms to move through the area this afternoon and evening into the overnight hours. Currently the second round during the late afternoon/evening looks to bring the better severe weather chances. Primary hazards are damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph and large hail up to quarters.

Multiple rounds of showers and thunderstorms will pose a risk for flash flooding throughout the rest of the week, especially where repeated thunderstorms track over the same areas. Antecedent conditions support additional flooding, with elevated streamflows and saturated soils. Rainfall rates of 1 to 2+ inches per hour can be expected within heavier thunderstorms.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- **"When thunder roars . . . go indoors!"**
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"
