DISCUSSION

There is a 30 to 50 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms this morning into early afternoon. There is a Slight (2 of 5) Risk for severe thunderstorms later this afternoon and evening with damaging winds as the primary threat and hail up to the size of quarters and weak tornadoes as the secondary threat.

There is a 40 to 70 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms Thursday night with a Slight (2 of 4) Risk for excessive rainfall and localized flash flooding as some rainfall amounts could reach 3 to 5 inches.

Heat index values may reach the upper 90s to around 100 degrees Today, though cloud cover and storm chances limit overall confidence in excessive heat.

CITIZEN ACTION STATEMENT

- Have a severe weather shelter plan. Review your emergency kit and identify the closest safe shelter.
- Have a way of receiving severe weather warnings (NOAA Weather Radio, social media, news media, etc.)
- Take shelter when lightning is in the area.
- Citizens with outdoor recreational plans along rivers and streams should be alert for the potential for lightning strikes and rapidly rising water levels.

"Turn around . . . don't drown!"

- **Drink plenty of water:** Water, sports drinks, and electrolyte solutions can help replace lost fluids and electrolytes.
- **Know the signs of heat illness:** Heavy sweating, muscle cramps, nausea, dizziness, and headaches to name a few.

"Dress light and hydrate!"
