QUESTION 1

Shall the City of Springfield, Missouri, continue a sales tax of one-fourth of one percent for the purpose of funding highpriority capital improvements such as: intersection improvements including new traffic signals and additional turn lanes at Battlefield Road and Fremont Avenue; widening Fremont Avenue from Sunset Street to Battlefield Road and adding sidewalks and bike path; widening Primrose Street from South to Kimbrough Avenue with new traffic signal at Jefferson Street; Municipal Street and Infrastructure Improvements/Rehabilitation: Stormwater Permit Compliance and flood prevention; School Sidewalk and Sidewalk Repair Programs: Neighborhood Initiative Program; Safety Signing and Marking; Traffic Signal and Calming Program; Center City Development; Design and Right-of-Way Projects: Reforestation and Landscaping and public/private cost share investments related to economic development and quality of life enhancements through shared funding with the County, State, Federal agencies and developers to advance high-priority projects, with the tax to sunset in three vears?

(Note: There will be no increase in the current sales tax level if the one-fourth of one percent Capital Improvements Tax is continued.)

QUESTION 2

Shall the City of Springfield, Missouri, continue a sales tax of one-eighth of one percent for transportation purposes to fund high-priority transportation improvements such as: replacing the Grand Street Bridge and providing bike lanes, sidewalks and rail crossing improvements between Park Avenue and Kansas Expressway, widening Cherry Street, adding bike lanes and sidewalks from Barnes Avenue to Oak Grove Avenue: adding dual left turn lanes on Republic Road at Campbell Avenue and widening Republic Road from Campbell Avenue to the driveway at Chase; relocating Eastgate Avenue on south side of Chestnut Expressway to new traffic signal location to the east; Pavement Preservation/Major Street Resurfacing and Rehabilitation projects; Traffic Flow and Safety projects; Bridge Repair and Replacement; Alternate Transportation projects including sidewalks, bike routes, transit, and rail crossing improvements; Design and Right-of-Way Projects and transportation investments related to economic development and quality of life enhancements through shared funding with County, State, and Federal agencies and developers to advance high-priority projects, with the tax to sunset in four years?

(Note: There will be no increase in the current sales tax level if the one-eighth of one percent Transportation Sales Tax is continued.)



Shall the Marion C. Early R-5 School District, Polk County, Missouri board of education borrow money in the amount of \$1,000,000 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, renovating and improving school facilities of the District, including construction and installation of ramps, lifts, entryways and restrooms to bring the District into compliance with the with Americans Disabilities reconstruction of the entryway to the Fieldhouse, roof repairs, paving parking lots and furnishing and equipping the same and issue bonds for the payment thereof resulting in no increase to the debt service levy?

If this proposition is approved, the debt service levy of the school district is estimated to remain unchanged at \$0.4900 per one hundred dollars assessed valuation of real and personal property.







QUESTION

Shall the Reorganized School District No. 2 (Willard) of Greene County, Missouri board of education borrow money in the amount of \$5,500,000 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, renovating and improving school facilities of the District, including constructing a classroom addition at Orchard Hills Elementary School, installation of an HVAC system at North Elementary School, acquiring land for school purposes, procuring architectural services for an intermediate school to be constructed and furnishing and equipping the same and issue bonds resulting in no increase to the debt service levy?

If this proposition is approved, the debt service levy of the District is estimated to remain unchanged at \$0.9738 per one hundred dollars assessed valuation of real and personal property.

The authorization of said bonds will authorize the levy and collection of an annual tax in addition to all other taxes provided for by law on all taxable tangible property in said School District sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as they fall due and to retire the same within twenty (20) years from the date thereof.
