Informational Items

Budget Office—Jeff Scott

Tina gave an update of out-of-county inmates. The Greene County Jail is housing 601 inmates today. Tina reported on the counties used to house inmates and the cost at each county. The counties being used at this time are Cedar, Vernon, Henry, Johnson and Miller Counties. There was a discussion of inmate projections for the end of the year as well as those at the end of 2017.

Human Resources—Camille Knowles

Camille reported that Chet Hunter, Director of Office of Emergency Management (OEM) has resigned effective August 27. Camille gave a history of the position and explained that 80% of the position is funded by city and 20% by the county. Camille had the Commission review a copy of the job description for this position and asked if the Commission would like to make any revisions. There were no revisions indicated.

There was a discussion of naming an Interim Director for OEM.

Camille informed the Commission that the Highway Department has asked about DB Square and presenting a plan for Highway employees. The Highway Department employees have asked for a salary plan.
