Kathryn/Ashley Raycheck-Health Department

Kathryn spoke to the Commission about The Annual Report for 2016 went on to talk about some of the highlights of the report. Ashley Raycheck explained to the Commission about the Mumps cases, explained about outbreak settings. There have been 25 confirmed cases in Greene County, 9 of those cases in public school, 5 have been in the college setting. Immunizations are available at the walk-in clinic at Jordan Valley.

Zim-E911
