#### **MINUTES**

Presiding Commissioner Bob Cirtin called the meeting of January 06, 2017 to order.

# **Resource Management Update**

Kevin Barnes told the Commission that his department quickly dealt with recent snow on the campus parking lots. He said working is progressing at Cox Tower. He's currently working on replacing blinds for the windows of the Prosecuting Attorney Office floors and is looking into costs. He has also been working with Information Systems and Doug Shy of OSCA to ensure that the OSCA system is set up for the new location. Barnes said he recently met with the Judges to discuss construction on the north end of the Judicial Center and he believes that they now have a better understanding of the layout and strategy. The Department is currently working on a site plan for the Southerland Property with Paragon Architecture. Once that is done, they will move to working on space planning and design.

## **County Administrator Update**

Chris Coulter informed the Commission that three appointments would need to be made soon for the 911 Advisory Board. Seats becoming vacant are: at-large, fire departments, and municipalities. It was agreed to send a letter out to all Greene County mayors asking them to encourage prospective candidates to apply.

## Other Items

Harold Bengsch stated that he would not be present at the Daily Briefing on January 10, as he would be attending a meeting of the Healthy Living Alliance. The Missouri Foundation for Health recently turned down the Health Department's grant application, but said there is another grant coming up that better fits the mental health focus of the Healthy Living Alliance. The Health Department will pursue this.
