Jon Mooney and Jordan Coiner gave a presentation on the Health Department's program Canary Measure. It is a tool that allows community leaders to explore the interaction of a neighborhood's conditions on health behaviors which affect health outcome. Mooney said that their current focus is on lung, heart, and mental health.

E911 Director Zim Schwartz said staff will be meeting next week to install logging recorder equipment. She said they are also preparing to add six new employees in 2019. She said text to 911 is going well, with about 25 to 30 texts per month coming through. JR Mooney noted that last month they hosted a statewide 911 conference that was well attended.

OEM Deputy Director Samantha Foster told the Commission that the month of September brought 43 tours and meetings to the Public Safety Center, with a total of about 460 meetings so far this year.

Budget Officer Jeff Scott told the Commission that sales tax totals came in lower than they were this time a year ago, but that he doesn't see a cause for concern because in looking at the 12 month average, sales tax revenue still grew and we are still experiencing increasing growth. He explained that factors such as timing of holidays and weather conditions can impact what the revenue trends look like.
