Resource Management Director Kevin Barnes highlighted the recent water conference held on 10/30. Historic Courthouse hours have been changed 7:45a.m.-4:45 p.m. The over flow issue at the jail is still on going, it was recently discovered that there were vents clogged with rocks which has contributed to the overflow issue and work will begin on 11/02 to remove the rocks. Currently the Operations Center and tuck pointing are delayed due to weather. The jail elevator should begin work on 11/12. Barnes will send out an invite to the commission for an event on 11/15 which pertains to flood plains.

County Administrator Chris Coulter gave a brief update to the Commission about the Opioids lawsuit, Housely county Councilor has heard from Garvey the attorney on the lawsuit and was informed it will be pulled from St. Louis court and placed in federal court. Pretrial will now have limited access to casenet, Coulter went on to explain options that may be available to Pretrial to have the access that they had prior to the OSCA change.

Public Information Officer Donna Barton informed Commission that Casey Lawrence from the Attorney General's office will be in Springfield 11/28-11/29 and has offered to do a presentation on sunshine law if Greene County is interested. Barton was contacted by a company offering services in digital archiving of social media and will reach out to the County Clerk's office to see if they would be interested in using their services. Facebook engagement is up 55% and outreach is up 155% in the last 7 days, page views are also up a total of 84%.
