Informational Items

1. Information Systems—Jess Kerr

- Currently migrating from a commercial cloud to the government cloud. First migration happened last weekend. One more to take place in near future (TBA). Spam filter is back up and users will see a reduction in spam over time.
- Recently configured new EMC VNX storage system. Spent \$40,000 less than anticipated. Will be installed by May and will be good for five years. Our wireless system will need updates soon but the cost should be covered by the surplus from the storage configuration project.
- On April 25, at PSC, there will be a Cisco Safety City Safe County Workshop. More details TBA.

2. Purchasing—Chris Mericle

- No move date set yet for Prosecutor's move to Cox Tower.
- RFP almost ready for Historic Courthouse Roof project. Sending it to the state for approval this week.
- Seven contractors showed up for pre-bid meeting on Cox Tower Renovation. Opens 3/21.
- Jamestown- RFP is under final review, hopefully issued this week.
- May not issue award for Polling Tablets; County Clerk's office seems unimpressed by bidders.
- Treehouse is the vendor chosen for ink cartridges and toner.
- Demolition of house on FR. 105: No asbestos. Opens 3/21.
- Cissell Washer (Jail): Will be approximately \$10k over original quote, which was done by jail. Major Spaulding says the money will be pulled from other areas in their budget. Opens 3/22.
- There were some tech issues with the vendor for the Electronic Docket but an award letter should go out later this week.
- DBE Initiative: We spent \$27,172,658 last year on order through purchasing. Of that, about \$700,000 was spent with DBE. That's 2.58%. This is an approximation. There is likely a larger number; however, current listing options in Eden limit how to select a category. Soon those options will be expanded to make it easier to list businesses as DBE's in the system. This will increase the number of DBE's in stats.
- Moved 9 years of files to Archives.
- Purchasing trends: There have been a lot of "green initiatives" – businesses using green supplies/ recycled paper, etc. Missouri ranked as #7 in technology in purchasing due to habits such as having a bid/contract system online and apps for vendors.
