Items for Consideration and Action by the Commission

- 1. Vehicle Proposal—Sheriff Jim Arnott
 - Sheriff Arnott comes to the Commission to get a guideline regarding the disassembling of Sheriff Department vehicles that will no longer be used in the fleet with regard to removing electrical system, decals, lights etc. The Highway Department has indicated they will not be able to provide this service on a consistent, timely manner in order for the vehicles to be processed.

The Sheriff offered two other alternate suggestions for consideration which would be to create a Quarter Master position to handle this function or pay overtime to Sheriff Department employees to complete the task.

The Sheriff noted that it takes about 14 hours to disassemble a vehicle with two men working on the job/about 7 hours per person.

During the meeting a call was made to the Highway Department to verify if employees would want to take overtime to complete this task. The answer was no.

The Commissioners approved to use overtime to the Sheriff's Department for this project.

- 1. Budget Office—Jeff Scott
 - Jeff indicates that he and Tina will be attending a grant symposium in Columbia, MO tomorrow.
 - Based on recent news articles, Jeff has put together some 2015 numbers regarding actual expenses with an outline of source of payment.
